# **Principal's Report**

Welcome to the New School Year. What a smooth start we have had to the school year, given the very complex operations that the school is currently operating within.

It was certainly pleasing to be able to welcome students back to face to face learning on Monday and it was indeed impressive to see students embrace the return to school in such a positive and studious manner in their classrooms.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Sean Marshall for his contribution to the school over the last three years. He has accepted a position at Sherbourne Primary School and will be working there this year to pursue different leadership opportunities.

This change has provided us the opportunity to move Diana Lovat into the classroom. Diana brings a wealth of experience as a classroom teacher and this will only benefit the students learning.

#### **Upcoming School Council Elections**

All government schools in Victoria have a School Council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within state-wide guidelines. In doing this, a School Council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

Parents on School Councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school. Those parents who become active on a School Council find their involvement satisfying in itself and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging/engagement.

Each year, approximately half of the School Council retires to allow new members to become involved. To this end, we are now formally calling for nominations for the 2022/2023 Lower Plenty PS School Council. Membership on the council is for a period of two years and regular meetings are held twice a term.

On Tuesday we will post a compass message detailing the number of positions that are vacant so that you can come in and fill in a nomination form if interested. If we receive more nominations that positions available, an election process will follow in the coming weeks.

We will confirm the final membership of the 2022 School Council in the newsletter when the election process has been completed.
